



What to do next!

When mold conditions are extreme and the recommendations are to vacate the home it is important to follow a few simple procedures so as to not take the mold with you.

- Upon leaving the home we recommend changing clothes ASAP. Put the clothing in a trash bag and seal it up until they can be washed.
- Take a shower and wash your hair to remove mold spores from your body.
- Wear protective outfits (respirators, Tyvek suits, rubber gloves, etc...) before entering again.
- Any furniture or personal items being moved to a new location should be taken outside and treated.
 - All fibrous surfaces and cloth items must be washed and treated, including but not limited to:
 - Wood furniture
 - Curtains and bedspreads
 - Clothing, socks, and shoes
 - Couches and chairs with padding
 - Mattresses and box springs
 - Rugs and carpeting
 - Wash rags, towels, etc...
 - All contaminated cellulose or paper items must be professionally treated or disposed of, including but not limited to:
 - Books
 - Pictures and art work
 - Cardboard boxes
 - Christmas decorations, etc...
 - All hard surfaces should be wiped down and treated, including but not limited to:
 - Metal bed frames
 - Pictures frames, glass, and mirrors
 - Dishes, glasses, and silverware
 - Tables and chairs
 - Washing machines and dryers
 - Waste baskets, laundry baskets, etc...
 - All mechanical devices should be wiped down and treated (if applicable the casing should be removed and the cooling fan blades wiped clean and the interior vacuumed as best as possible).
 - Window air conditioners, fans, and dehumidifiers
 - Computers, printers, and scanner
 - Televisions, VCR and DVD players

Please use extreme caution and protection when entering a home contaminated with high levels or toxic mold conditions. We recommend only professional mold remediators perform cleanup procedures.
